Salmo salar once populated the Connecticut River watershed but were locally eradicated by the year 1805. Since 1967, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services and the CT Department of Energy and Environmental Protection have been working to repopulate the Connecticut River basin. Recent observations suggest that adult salmon have spawned in the Connecticut river watershed for the first time in over 200 years. Ecology students at Manchester Community College have participated in the restoration and will report on their activities.
