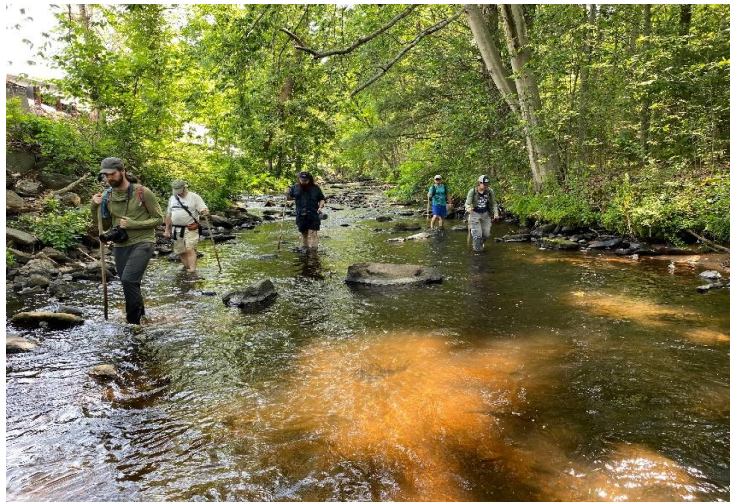

It's HOT in New England! Water temperatures, reported at the Thompsonville gauge, climbed from 20C (68F) on June 25th to above 26C (79F) today. Main stem river discharge hovered around 15,000 cfs most of the week, but is now bouncing up and down around 10,000 cfs, pretty much the 23-year median. Of interest, CT DEEP recorded 713 white suckers this year at Moulson Pond, a new record. Please note that video at Turners Falls' Gatehouse is still being reviewed, but they have already passed more shad than any previous year. On top of that, two Atlantic salmon passed the ladder at Cabot Station on June 28th. They have not been observed passing the Gatehouse ladder, so could be making their way through the power canal at this time. Will either get to Vernon?!
